

**Subject:** How To Remove A Cover –  
SolarForce® 648

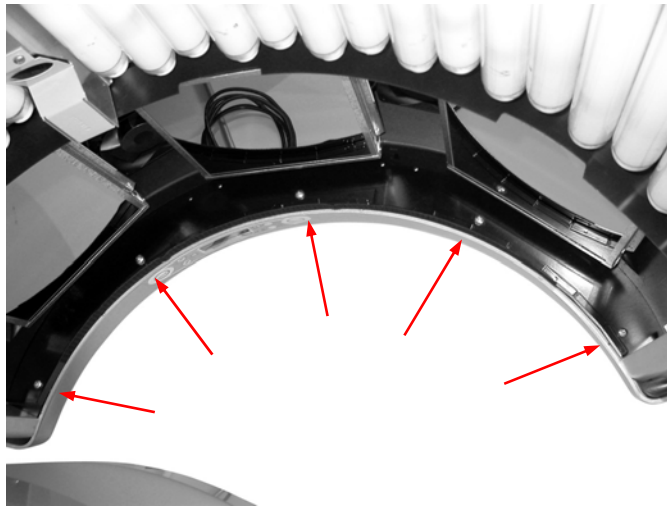

**Date:** 5/3/2006

**Overview:** Always disconnect power before removing any protective covers. Proceed carefully and avoid pulling any wiring.

- Procedure:**
1. Unlock the canopy acrylic and open it (see owners manual). You may wish to remove it.
  2. At either end of the canopy, inside the tanning area are five (5) screws securing the endcaps to the unit (see picture below). Remove these screws, gently lift the endcap and remove it. Be careful! The head-end endcap has the timer display cable attached. Disconnect it.
  3. If you did not remove the acrylic, close and latch it now.
  4. Remove the vent hoses and power cables from the back of the canopy.
  5. Remove the screws holding the back edge of the canopy cover and remove the cover. The canopy will rise due to the decreased weight.
  6. Reinstall the cover by reversing the above directions. When installing the endcaps, remember to connect the timer display.
